**Correction - M365 Team Names** We've been advised of an error in the item in yesterday's Daily Brief re: the renaming of M365 Teams names. Team names will be changed to **GRAM** and not NHSG as stated in the item. New Teams created should follow naming convention of **GRAM – Name of TEAM (GRAM space hyphen space NAME)**.

As a member of a Team, you don't have to do anything, these changes will happen automatically. If you are an owner of an existing team, or creating a new team in the future, you must maintain/use the standard described above. If you are unsure of the prefix that you should be using, please reach out to your local M365 support team.
