

HIDDEN HAZARDS:THE AMERICAN CANDY INGREDIENTS BANNED IN THE UK

Bright colours, bold flavours and banned ingredients; the demand for American confectionary has skyrocketed in recent years, as a result of social media trends on platforms such as TikTok and Instagram. However, many of these popular products contain ingredients which have been banned in the UK (but are permitted in other countries) due to health concerns.

So, what exactly are these banned ingredients? Commonly found in Swedish Fish, Jolly Ranchers and candy corn, mineral oil is a versatile product, derived from petroleum distillation and refining. It is used in cosmetics, industrial machinery and to give confectionary a shiny coating. Classed as a group 1 carcinogen, mineral oil is prohibited in all foods in the UK under *The Food Additives, Flavourings, Enzymes and Extraction Solvents (Scotland) Regulations 2013.* Another ingredient of concern is Red dye 3, or E127. This organoiodine compound is a derivative of fluorone and has been linked to hyperactivity, behaviour problems and is believed to increase the risk of thyroid tumours. It is only approved for use in cocktail or candied cherries in the UK. Many American bakery products such as Pop Tarts, which are popular as a breakfast food, contain bleached flour. The benzoyl peroxide used in the bleaching process may be linked to an increased risk of developing cancer.

Despite being banned in the UK, some of these ingredients still find their way into the market through imported American products, leaving consumers unaware of potential risks. In some cases, products identified have been relabelled for the UK market usually in the form of stickers placed over the original ingredients section on the packaging. These new labels often omit the presence of the banned ingredients thus misleading consumers into thinking the products are safer than they are. Environmental Health Services in Scotland and Trading Standards Services in England have already undertaken enforcement action resulting in a significant amount of affected products being removed from sale.
