

Inverurie Community Maternity Unit (CMU) at the new Inverurie Health & Care Hub

This information sheet aims to answer questions you may have about the move of the Community Maternity Unit to the new Inverurie Health & Care Hub on the Inverurie Hospital site. If you do have any other questions you can ask your Midwife or staff at the Community Maternity Unit.

When will the new building be open?

The new Inverurie Health & Care Hub will open on Monday 27 August 2018. The Community Maternity Unit (CMU) at Inverurie will open initially for staff orientation, induction and training only. The following services will be introduced gradually over the next few months:

- Antenatal day assessment service
- Ultrasound scanning
- Obstetric consultant clinic
- Facilities for midwifery led labour and birth

Your community midwife or a member of staff at the Community Maternity Unit will be able to keep you informed and updated about the stages of available services.

What is in the new building?

In addition to housing the Community Maternity Unit, other services will also be in the new building. These include Care Management, Community Audiology, Community Cardiology, Community Nursing (including District Nursing), Physiotherapy, Podiatry, Public Health

Nursing (including Health Visiting and Community Midwifery), Radiology, Speech and Language Therapy (SALT), Urie Dental Practice as well as visiting specialist consultant clinics. There is also the Inverurie Medical Group and an office base for Allied Health Professionals.

Will there be parking near the new building?

Car parking provision has been greatly increased. There are now 240 standard parking spaces (this is an additional 145 spaces) and there are now 21 disabled spaces (an additional 7 spaces). In addition there are 5 new parent and child spaces and 4 new motorcycle spaces. There are covered bicycle stands that provide space for parked bicycles.

There are 3 new paved walkways from Kellands Park giving direct access to the new Inverurie Health & Care Hub building.

The service operates within Inverurie from 9.30am to 2.15pm on Mondays to Fridays. If you have a minor injury, you can attend the Minor Injury service at the Inverurie Medical Group from 8am to 6pm Monday to Fridays. Outside these hours and at weekends please telephone NHS24 on 111.

If you have a genuine medical emergency you should call 999.

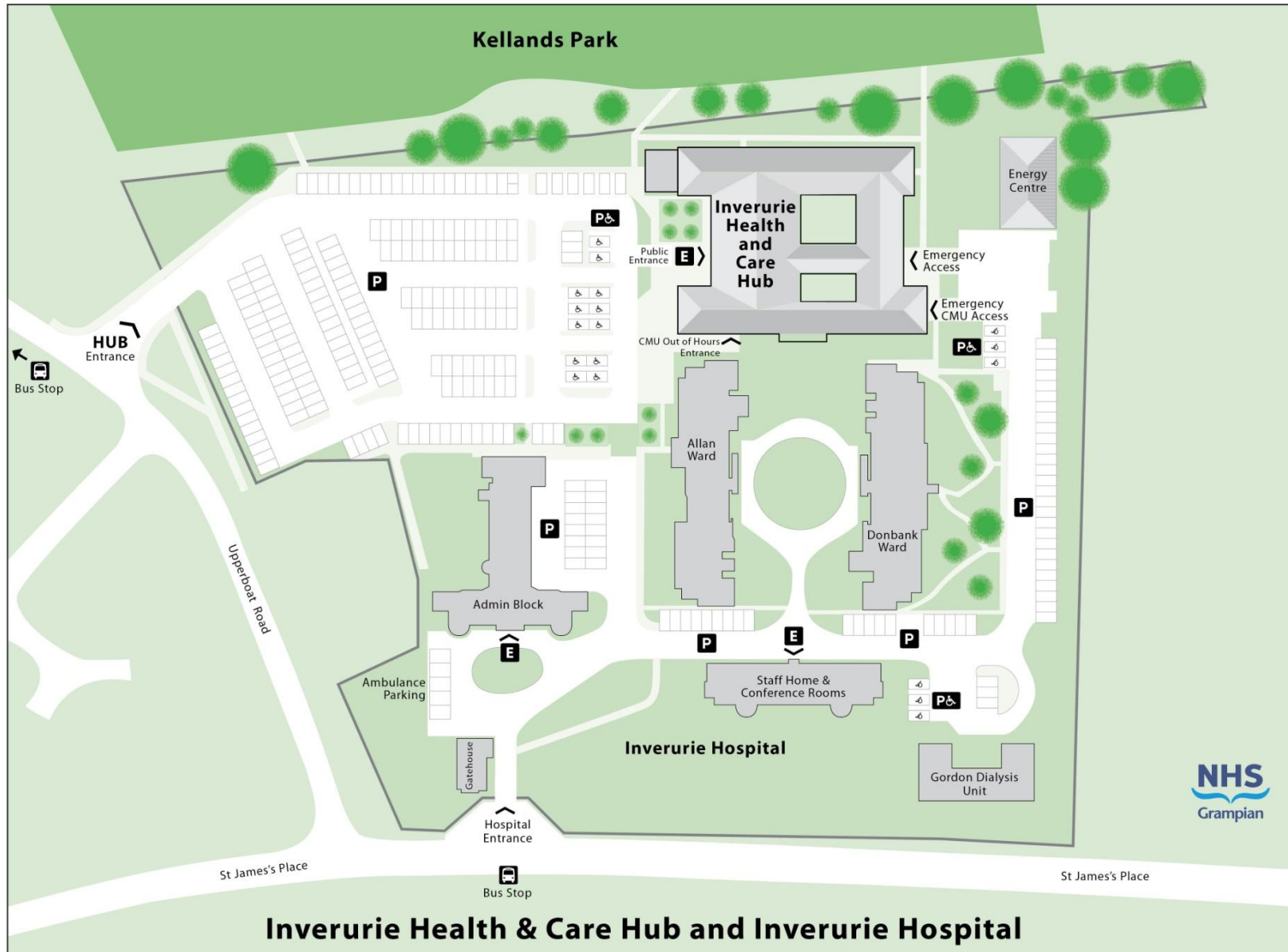
