Aim

Aims

This policy aims to:

- Outline the official role of NHS Grampian Charity.
- Provide a framework for NHS Grampian to ensure that NHS Grampian is maximising the support it gives to its Official Charity – and thereby to its patients and staff – through the opportunities it can provide to reach potential donors and supporters.
- Provide NHS Grampian staff with the right information to help donors and supporters understand the role of NHS Grampian Charity so they can make a well-informed decision on which charity to support.
- Protect patients, visitors and staff from receiving too many fundraising messages, which they may not wish to receive.
- Provide NHS Grampian staff with the right information on where to direct other charities which support or may wish to support NHS Grampian, to ensure they are well-informed and clear on their remit across NHS Grampian, its buildings and online.
- Clarify which organisations can and cannot undertake fundraising and promotional activities, clearly outlining the various types of activities and the processes for their approval and coordination, thereby maximising support NHS Grampian gives to its official charity and associated charities.
- Provide staff with clarity and guidance on receiving donations, fundraising, charitable support activities and working in partnership on

income generating activities; and provide clear and concise information to staff to relay to donors to enable them to make well informed decisions

- Define the associated responsibilities of NHS Grampian staff, and the governance and procedures required when receiving donations or proceeds from fundraising activities in alignment with NHS Grampian's Standing Financial Instructions (SFI's).
- Set out guidance for any fundraising activity involving NHS Grampian staff time, use of NHSG premises or other assets including grounds, shops and concessions, where NHSG (or any part of it) is the intended beneficiary. This includes the filming and photography of staff, patients and premises for the purpose of fundraising activities.
- Provide staff with information to help them understand the role of each charity aligned to NHS Grampian. This will ensure transparency and clarity with patients and visitors when asking about charitable support and where donations go, or how to obtain further information about fundraising should they, or a supporter, request it.
- Define the responsibilities of NHS Grampian staff regarding the governance and procedures required when receiving donations or fundraising proceeds.
- Set out a framework for any fundraising involving NHS Grampian staff, use of NHS Grampian premises or other assets including grounds, shops and concessions, where NHS Grampian (or any part of it) is the intended beneficiary.

Purpose

The purpose of the policy is to provide clear guidance that is open, honest with fair practices to meet fundraising regulations and best practices.
